

Issue #1:

Oil and Natural Gas Exploration Blockage
 The Washington Examiner Journalist, Bethany Blankley in a October 25, 2021, article wrote about New Mexico’s political landscape. New Mexico Governor, Michelle Lujan Grisham is up for reelection next year. “Grisham sought to receive an exemption from one of the first executive orders President Joe Biden issued banning new leasing for oil and gas operations on federal lands, knowing more than one-third of the state’s budget comes from oil and gas revenue. Her request was denied by the Biden administration.”

“It is clear Joe Biden, Michelle Lujan Grisham and their eco-enablers have delivered terrible results to our state,” Larry Behrens, Power the Future communications director, told The Center Square. “Gas prices are



skyrocketing, electric bills are up”. As struggling families must shell out more hard-earned money to pay for a failed agenda, many are asking the key question: why? The results reveal the simple answer, leaders in Washington and Santa Fe care more about environmental special interests than our families.”

“Grisham’s Republican challengers agree. One, former state Rep. Gregg Zanetti, argues that Grisham’s lockdown policies and “Follow the ‘science’ morphed into consolidating power.” resulting in the shuttering of thousands of small businesses “while big-box stores made record profits.” “Schools were needlessly closed,” he said. “Suicides, depression, and abuse cases leapt,” then Grisham “embraced free money over hard work,” which continues “to hinder our path to recovery as we now have a labor shortage just when businesses are trying to get to their feet.”

“Sandoval Commissioner Jay Block, another Republican gubernatorial candidate, issued a resolution to reopen the state, calling for an end to lockdowns, arguing Grisham “favored her crony corporations over hard-working small business owners of new Mexico. Small

businesses are operating at a 37% loss in revenue, and we have seen 87,000 jobs disappear.”

“Oil and natural gas contributes \$2.8 billion to New Mexico’s state budget, the New Mexico Oil and Gas Association points out. In 2020, it accounted for 34% of the state’s budget; in 2019, 39%.”

“Royalties, taxes and fees paid for by the industry contribute to more than one-third of the funding for public schools, infrastructure, health care and public safety, more than any other industry in New Mexico. Total education funding surpasses \$1.37 billion, with the majority \$1,062,500,00 going to K-12 education alone. The industry funding per student is \$3,788 and per teacher \$60,062.”

Issue #2:

Redistricting of Congressional Districts to Squeeze Out Republican Representation
The following is an article from the Las Cruces Sun News by Associated Press journalist Morgan Lee, dated October 16, 2021. “an advisory board on redistricting endorsed several plans for realigning the boundaries of political districts across New Mexico on Friday (October 15th), backing proposed congressional districts that would consolidate Native American representation and strengthen a Hispanic majority.”

“The recommendations of the Citizens Redistricting Committee are a nonbinding reference point for the Legislature as it enters the once-a-decade process of drawing new political boundaries.”

“New Mexico’s Democratic led Legislature plans to convene in



December to redraw the boundaries for the state’s three congressional districts, 112 legislative seats and a commission that oversees public charter schools.”
New Mexico Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham holds veto authority in the process. It has been 30 years since Democrats controlled both the governors office and Legislature during redistricting.”

“Last year, U.S. Rep. Yvette Herrell ousted a first-term Democrat from the 2nd District seat. The district’s boundaries are likely to shift and contract to offset population gains in a oil-producing region in the southeastern corner of the state. The advisory committee endorsed three separate

plans for redrawing the state's three congressional districts.”
“Nearly 48% of state residents claim Hispanic ancestry - the highest portion in the nation. The share of new Mexico residents who identify themselves as Indigenous by race or by combined ancestry was 12.4%, a percentage surpassed only by Alaska and Oklahoma.

The state is home to 23 federally recognized tribes, whose growing political clout is reflected in the election of Laguna Pueblo tribal member Deb Haaland to Congress in 2016 and her promotion this year to secretary of the Interior. The seven-member redistricting committee has held more than a dozen public meetings across the state and vowed to endorse at least three proposed maps each for Congress as well as state Senate and Congress.” Redistricting actions are also being conducted in Delaware, Hawaii, Texas, and Vermont.

Issue #3:

Gov. Grisham Announces Extreme eco-Marxist Agenda at 'climate summit'
The following excerpts are from an article in the Pinon Post, dated October 26, 2021.

“MLG announces extreme eco-Marxist agenda at 'climate summit' as New Mexicans protest” “On Monday (October 25th), far -left eco-Marxist groups and public figures gathered at the Capitol

in Santa Fe to talk about the 'climate change' conspiracy theory put on by House Speaker Brian Egolf (D-Santa Fe). As previously reported by the Pinon Post, Egolf's "New Mexico Climate Summit" is costing New Mexico taxpayers at least \$14,134.”

“At the event, scandal-ridden alleged serial groper Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham announced radical job-killing proposals she aims to ram through the 2022 Legislative Session that will not only cripple New Mexico's energy economy but will harm the poor in significant ways. These proposals include “net-zero” greenhouse gas emissions by 2050, “clean fuel standards,” and the introduction of a hydrogen hub act. In 2021, the clean fuel standards bill died after it did not achieve final passage on the House floor. The bill would have resulted in at least a 20-cent gas tax that would harm the poorest New Mexicans, already struggling in Lujan Grisham's economy.”

“Outside, protesters gathered from across New Mexico to oppose the job-killing proposals being implemented in the state. Signs read things like, “MLG's Green new Deal Kills” and “You Are The Carbon They Want to Reduce”. At the protest organized by activist Marcie May and others, Pinion Post editor John Block, secretary of state candidate Audrey Trujillo, GOP lieutenant

gubernatorial candidate Ant Thornton, GOP former U.S. Senate candidate Elisa Martinez, and others spoke about how eco-left policies are killing jobs in America.”

“Pro-energy group Power The Future’s communications director Larry Behrens said, New Mexico is a national leader in unemployment and rising electric bills so it is no surprise Governor Lujan Grisham wants to jet off to Scotland and leave her record behind. Additionally, it is the height of hypocrisy for the Governor to hop on a plane instead of appearing virtually. New Mexicans deserve better than a Governor who depends on fossil fuels to travel and for her budget but then undermines our energy workers at elitist resorts among her friends.”

“”Lujan Grisham is set to fly to Glasgow for a climate summit, in which she will join leaders to discuss the climate change conspiracy theory.”

Support for District Two Congressional Representative Yvette Herrell
Excerpts from Pinon Post article by journalist John Block, dated October 21, 2021. “According to the latest Federal Election Commission reports, Congresswoman Yvette Herrell (R-NM-2) is crushing her Democrat opponent Gabe Vasquez with her fundraising numbers.

The reports show that donors poured \$500, 192.70 into Herrell’s war chest between July 15 and September 30. During that timeframe, Herrell’s campaign spent \$218,338.24 and closed the period with nearly one million dollars -

\$980,687.50 - cash on hand.
